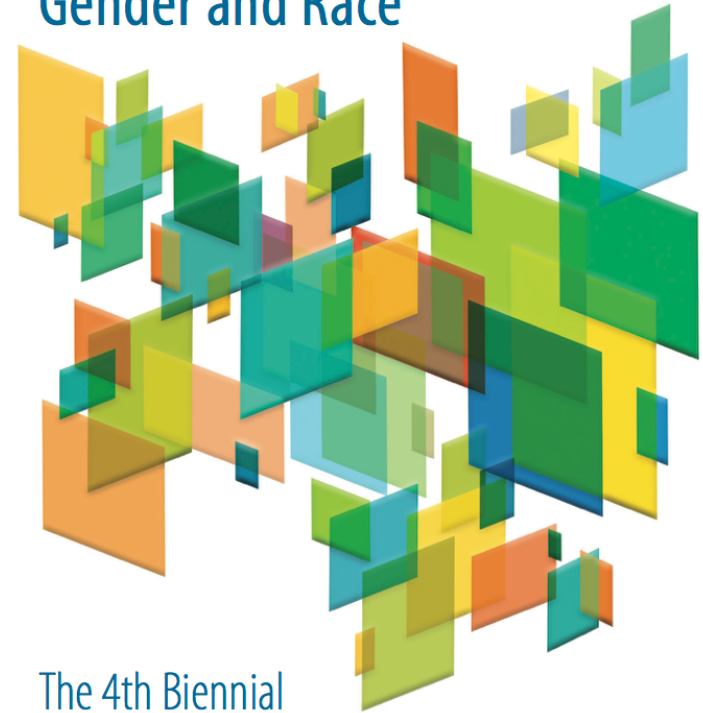
### Religious Services

Erev Shabbat and Shabbat services are held within walking distance of campus at Temple Beth-El (Reform), 305 W Madison St. (40-minute walk), and Sinai Synagogue (Conservative), 1102 E Lasalle Ave. (30-minute walk) (See [tbe-sb.org](http://tbe-sb.org) or [sinaisynagogue.org](http://sinaisynagogue.org) for detailed times and additional information.)
