## Back by Midnight and Broken Mirrors: The Fairy Tale in European Tradition

Fairy tales are a staple of popular culture with roots in folklore tradition. In this course we will investigate the enduring popularity of the fairy tale and the extent to which they reflect child-rearing, political or social norms.

#### Gender, Space, and the City

This seminar examines how British literature shaped and was shaped by two pivotal transformations in the 19th and 20th centuries: the growing dominance of the city in national life and rapidly changing roles for women.
